Public Health (COVID-19 Areas of Concern) Notice 2021 (No 383)

made under the

Public Health (COVID-19 Affected Areas) Emergency Direction 2021, paragraph 1

1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Public Health (COVID-19 Areas of Concern) Notice 2021 (No 383)*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences at 11:30am (AEDT) on 18 November 2021.

3 COVID-19 affected areas, COVID-19 places of concern, close contact exposure locations and casual contact exposure locations

I, Dr Kerryn Coleman, Chief Health Officer, identify each area or place mentioned in:

- a. Schedule 1, at or during the stated times for the area or place, to be a COVID-19 affected area; and
- b. Schedule 2, at or during the stated times for the area or place, to be a COVID-19 Place of Concern; and
- c. Schedule 3, at or during the stated time for the area or place, to be a Close Contact Exposure Location and subject to any conditions or guidance listed in the Schedule; and
- d. Schedule 4, at or during the stated time for the area or place, to be a Casual Contact Exposure Location and subject to any conditions or guidance listed in the Schedule.

4 Revocation

This instrument revokes all previous Public Health (COVID-19 Areas of Concern) Notices.

SCHEDULE 1

COVID-19 Affected Areas

COVID-19 Affected Areas – Victoria and NSW

The following conditions apply to all Areas outlined in the table on Page 4 of this Notice

For all travellers who have spent any time in the previous 14 days in the Areas outlined below and are seeking to enter the ACT from 11:59pm on Friday 12 November 2021:

TRAVELLERS WHO ARE FULLY VACCINATED:

1. Travellers are permitted to enter the ACT for any reason.
2. Travellers must complete an exemption form within 72 hours of their intended arrival into the ACT.
3. Exemption documentation will be issued immediately confirming entry into the ACT.
4. Travellers must monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 for 14 days from the last date in the area. If any symptoms develop, you must seek testing immediately and isolate until a negative result is received.

TRAVELLERS WHO ARE NOT FULLY VACCINATED:

1. Individuals are required to *Stay at Home* until 14 days have passed since last in the area.
2. Individuals are permitted to leave their premises for the following:
 - a. To undertake essential work or study, if they cannot work or study from home or remotely.
 - b. To attend usual childcare arrangements, where parents or guardians need to undertake essential work or study.
 - c. To shop for essentials like groceries, medicine, and necessary supplies.
 - d. To attend to medical or health care needs including compassionate requirements, and looking after the vulnerable.
 - e. To attend a facility to receive a COVID-19 vaccination, where the individual is eligible for a vaccination in the ACT, an appointment has been booked, and the individual is not in isolation or in quarantine.
 - f. To exercise outdoors, limited to one hour per day.
 - g. For essential animal welfare purposes (e.g. to feed pets or livestock that live elsewhere).
 - h. Leaving due to an emergency.
3. All individuals aged 12 years and over must wear a mask at all times upon leaving their premises for the above-mentioned reasons. Mask wearing is not required if individuals are undertaking vigorous exercise outdoors.

In addition, unvaccinated travellers must comply with the following conditions:

Residents of the ACT must:

1. Complete an exemption form within 72 hours of their intended arrival into the ACT.
2. An exemption confirming the ACT resident's ability to enter the ACT will be issued following verification of identity, residency, confirmation of authority to leave the jurisdiction in which the person is currently located.

Non-Residents of the ACT must:

1. Not enter the ACT unless they obtain an exemption before arriving.
2. Where an exemption has been granted, comply with all Stay at Home requirements and/or any conditions outlined in the exemption documentation.

TRAVELLERS AGED UNDER 12 YEARS OF AGE:

1. Travellers aged under 12 years must apply the same conditions that apply to their accompanying parents or guardians.
2. For travellers aged under 12 years who are travelling unaccompanied, the following conditions will apply:
 - a. Undertake a COVID-19 test on entry into the ACT, and isolate until a negative result is received.
 - b. A further COVID-19 test is required to be undertaken between days 5 and 6 following entry into the ACT (if the traveller is still in the ACT). There is no need to isolate whilst awaiting a result.

Notes:

- Travellers must comply with all provisions outlined in the *Public Health (COVID-19 Affected Areas) Emergency Direction 2021*
- The definition of **fully vaccinated** is outlined in the *Public Health (COVID-19 Affected Areas) Emergency Direction 2021*.
- The exemption form can be found at: www.covid19.act.gov.au.
- If you have been to a COVID-19 Place of Concern (Close Contact Exposure site or Casual Contact Exposure site) you must also comply with the requirements outlined in Schedule 3.

Close Contact Exposure Locations – Australian Capital Territory

The following conditions apply to all Places outlined in the table on Page 7 to 8 of this Notice

Fully vaccinated residents of the ACT who are currently in the ACT must:

1. Complete an online form and upload proof of vaccination within 24 hours from the commencement of a COVID-19 Area of Concern notice.
2. Quarantine immediately for 7 days since attending the exposure location.
3. Undergo appropriate testing for COVID-19, regardless of whether symptoms are present, upon entering quarantine, on day 6 of the quarantine period and on day 12 or 13 since last attending the exposure location.
4. Not attend a high-risk setting between days 8 and 14, unless the setting is their usual residence or exempted by an authorised public health officer.
5. Monitor for symptoms for 14 days from the date last in a listed exposure location, and if they experience any symptoms of COVID-19, they must go to a COVID-19 testing clinic to be retested.

Note: The definition of **fully vaccinated** is outlined in the *Public Health (COVID-19 Diagnosed People and Close Contacts) Emergency Direction 2021*.

Unvaccinated residents of the ACT who are currently in the ACT must:

1. Complete an online form within 24 hours from the commencement of a COVID-19 Area of Concern notice.
2. Quarantine immediately for 14 days since attending the exposure location.
3. Undergo appropriate testing for COVID-19, regardless of whether symptoms are present, upon entering quarantine, on days 5 to 7 of the quarantine period and again on days 12 to 13.
4. Monitor for symptoms for 14 days from the date last in a listed exposure location, and if they experience any symptoms of COVID-19, they must go to a COVID-19 testing clinic to be retested.

Note: Close contacts under 12 years of age will be considered as **unvaccinated** close contacts and will be required to quarantine for 14 days.

Residents of the ACT who are not currently in the ACT must:

1. Follow the health advice of the jurisdiction they are currently in.
2. If required, seek an exemption from the appropriate jurisdiction, should they wish to return home to the ACT.
3. Seek an exemption from ACT Health prior to entering the ACT.

Note: Quarantine requirements will apply.

Non-Residents of the ACT who are not currently in the ACT must:

1. Follow the health advice of the jurisdiction they are currently in.

Note: Non-Residents of the ACT who travelled to the ACT prior to the commencement of this Notice must comply with the requirements for Residents of the ACT who are currently in the ACT based on their COVID-19 vaccination status.

Note: High risk setting means:

1. Aged care (residential, in-home, community)
2. Healthcare (all health care facilities operated by [Canberra Health Services](#), in a hospital, including public and private hospitals, day hospital, defined as a facility where a person is admitted for surgical or medical treatment and discharged on the same day, hospice, ambulance service or other patient transport service)
3. Places where services are provided to people with a disability (engaged by a registered NDIS provider, State or Territory Government; assistance with daily life tasks and personal activities, group or centre-based activities, provision of disability support to clients who work at a social enterprise business)
4. Correctional facility

Fully vaccinated residents of the ACT who are currently in the ACT must:

1. Complete an online form and upload proof of vaccination within 24 hours from the commencement of a COVID-19 Area of Concern notice.
2. Quarantine immediately for 7 days since attending the exposure location.
3. Undergo appropriate testing for COVID-19, regardless of whether symptoms are present, upon entering quarantine, on day 6 of the quarantine period and on day 12 or 13 since last attending the exposure location.
4. Not attend a high-risk setting between days 8 and 14, unless the setting is their usual residence or exempted by an authorised public health officer.
5. Monitor for symptoms for 14 days from the date last in a listed exposure location, and if they experience any symptoms of COVID-19, they must go to a COVID-19 testing clinic to be retested.

1. Complete an online form and upload proof of vaccination within 24 hours from the commencement of a COVID-19 Area of Concern notice.
2. Quarantine immediately for 7 days since attending the exposure location.
3. Undergo appropriate testing for COVID-19, regardless of whether symptoms are present, upon entering quarantine, on day 6 of the quarantine period and on day 12 or 13 since last attending the exposure location.

SCHEDULE 4

Casual Contact Exposure Locations

Note: Affected persons must comply with Part 6 of the Direction.

Casual Contact Exposure Locations – Australian Capital Territory

The following conditions apply to all Places outlined in the table on Pages 16 to 17 of this Notice

For impacted ACT residents and visitors:

1. Persons who have attended a listed Casual Contact Exposure Location in the ACT are to complete a self-declaration form within 24 hours of being in the Exposure Location, or within 24 hours from the commencement of a COVID-19 Area of Concern notice.
2. Undergo appropriate testing for COVID-19, regardless of whether symptoms are present, and quarantine at your place of residence or other suitable accommodation until informed of a negative test result
 - a. Persons who were at a casual contact location less than 5 days ago will need to undergo two tests. The person is to undergo the first test upon learning that they are a casual contact and quarantine until they receive a negative test result. The person must undergo a second test on day 6 after the person was at the casual contact exposure location.
 - b. Persons who were at a casual contact exposure location 5 or more days ago will only need to undergo one test, to be conducted as soon as possible upon learning that they are a casual contact. The person must remain in quarantine until the person receives a negative test result.
3. Continue to monitor for symptoms for 14 days from the date last in a listed exposure location, and if they experience any symptoms of COVID-19, they must go to a COVID-19 testing clinic to be retested.

Note: Points 2 and 3 continue to apply regardless of whether a negative test result was obtained in another jurisdiction.

Irrespective of tests conducted under Point 2, persons who are Casual Contacts should get tested again for COVID-19 if the person experiences any symptoms of COVID-19, no matter how mild.

Note: A test means a Reverse transcriptase polymerase chain reaction (PCR) COVID-19 test. Rapid Antigen Tests are not considered a COVID-19 test for the purposes of this Direction.

2. Undergo appropriate testing for COVID-19, regardless of whether symptoms are present, and quarantine at your place of residence or other suitable accommodation until informed of a negative test result
 - a. Persons who were at a casual contact location less than 5 days ago will need to undergo two tests. The person is to undergo the first test upon learning that they are a casual contact and quarantine until they receive a negative test result. The person must undergo a second test on day 6 after the person was at the casual contact exposure location.
 - b. Persons who were at a casual contact exposure location 5 or more days ago will only need to undergo one test, to be conducted as soon as possible upon learning that they are a casual contact. The person must remain in quarantine until the person receives a negative test result.
3. Continue to monitor for symptoms for 14 days from the date last in a listed exposure location, and if they experience any symptoms of COVID-19, they must go to a COVID-19 testing clinic to be retested.

Note: Points 2 and 3 continue to apply regardless of whether a negative test result was obtained in another jurisdiction.

Irrespective of tests conducted under Point 2, persons who are Casual Contacts should get tested again for COVID-19 if the person experiences any symptoms of COVID-19, no matter how mild.
